Hello from the Nurses Niche

Hi everyone,

I hope you are all enjoying the lovely spring weather and longer days I certainly am. This week I thought I would remind you all of our clinic hours and the best way to get hold of a nurse after hours. Monday to Friday the clinic is open from 9:00am to 4:30pm for drop in appointments as well as pre booked ones. If you need to see a nurse for a particular issue or outside of the normal clinic hours it might be best to make an appointment. As I can be out and about during the day a prearranged appointment can work well for those who like to be organised.

- If you are not too worried about a time please feel free to pop by ,as I usually have the clinic door open if I am in and free.
- If you have any flu like symptoms, coughing/sneezing or other respiratory symptoms please ring us before coming to the clinic to talk through a plan of care. This is very important for the safety of the village with COVID-19 still lurking around.
- Lyn is on duty every evening from 5pm until 9pm for any nursing related matters. She then remains on site overnight for urgent issues. Lyn will be out and about around the village so if you need to see her in the clinic after 5pm but before 9pm please phone to arrange a time.
- Saturday and Sunday clinic hours are 8:30am to 4:00pm for both prebooked and pop in appointments. Chris and Christine might be out of the clinic a bit over the weekend so again booking a time may work better for some.
- All emergencies will be attended 24/7 by the on-duty nurse. Please use your wall call points and personal alarms if you need urgent help. If you are unsure of how the system works please contact us and we can run through this with you.
- If you have a non-urgent issue outside of the clinic hours/nurses on-duty hours please phone the clinic in the morning.
- Please do not go to the nurses apartment after hours as it is important that the nurses have some rest time so they can manage the unexpected emergencies when they occur overnight.

Finally , can you all please take note of the **Registered Nurses phone number** and preferably code it into your phone. Some residents are ringing reception and leaving a message about a health issue or asking the nurse to call back and reception doesn't always pick these messages up until later in the day. This means the nurses won't know about the issue sometime until hours later. The nurses phone also has every residents contact number coded into it so can see who is ringing and if we are unable to take the call we can ring back as soon as we can.




Weekend Movie – The Bucket List

We meet at Reception Wednesday mornings @ 8.50am




