This treatment is weather dependant so if need be it will be delayed.

We are currently working through some further upgrades within the lodge area which will enhance the WIFI strength and will also include the provision of WIFI on the lower level including the cinema and the Gym area. We are also working on the capability of providing 'Spark Sport' so that you can enjoy the cricket over the summer months, unfortunately we may not have this available until mid-January and will keep you informed.

The bird box will be reauctioned on Friday 18th December with the opportunity for residents to bid on it.




Weekend Movie Andrea Bocelli & David Foster My Christmas In Concert






Unstoppable summer: our plan to manage COVID-19

While any response will depend on the circumstances such as the location or timing, it's useful to think of three scenarios over summer where or how a new case might appear in the community, but we've done a lot of planning to handle a wide range of possible situations. Our 'test, trace and isolate' approach focuses on being able to test lots of people and quickly trace and isolate contacts. We cannot predict COVID-19 is a tricky virus – we've learned a lot from our experience so far, but we all have a part to play in stopping the spread


SCENARIO: Contained border case


