Fire Evacuation Training - Next week we will be carrying out full evacuation training as part of our fire schemes. Please remember if you have issues with managing the stairs in the event of an emergency this will have been noted on the fire evacuation board. You should have an allocated person who will check on your well-being and then report to the building warden that you are still inside and will require assistance.

All buildings will have the fire alarm activated and you need to evacuate the building and report to your building warden, who will register your attendance and then report to the Chief Fire Warden. If you do not know who your building warden is, they will be identified by standing at the evacuation point wearing a high viz jerkin top.

Hello from the Nurses Niche

Well I have been at work on a number of different shifts this week as Lucy, Alana and I cover Lyn's second week of leave. Great to see people supporting the Silver Ferns on Sunday as they took the Constellation Cup off our Aussie friends for the first time in 9 years. There was also a good crowd cheering on Team NZ for the first America's cup race on Wednesday evening. One each but early days! Go Team NZ.

This week's fun fact is about our eyes:

- Each of your eyes measures about 2.5mm across and weighs about 7 grams.
- You blink about 12 times every minute.
- The average blink lasts for about 1/10 of a second.
- Seeing is such a big part of everyday life that it requires about half of the brain to get involved.
- Out of all the muscles in your body, the muscles that control your eyes are the most active.
- Some people are born with different coloured eyes. This conditions is heterochromia.
- 80% of vision problems worldwide are avoidable or curable.



- New-borns don't produce tears. They make crying sounds, but the tears don't start flowing until they are about 4-13 weeks old.
- Doctors have yet to find a way to transplant an eyeball. The optic nerve that connects the eye to the brain is too sensitive to reconstruct successfully.

Another part of the body we need to look after. Stop smoking, wear sunglass and get your eyes checked regularly.


FINAL PREP COAT ON CLASSIC DINGHY HULL
