Village Manager's Weekly Update

COVID – 19 Update

## Whilst we are currently at Alert Level 3, we should be informed by the government tomorrow if this will be changed.

If we move to Alert level 2 the key changes within the village to be aware of are:

- The community centre is only open to residents no visitors allowed.
- The café will reopen but dinners will be capped at 100.
- You can have visitors to your units.
- Activities can recommence and the village shopping bus will be operational.

## If we stay at Alert level 3, the current restrictions advised via letter on the 28<sup>th</sup> of February will remain in place.

Due to the uncertainly around the alert levels we have presented the food options in two formats for next week. One is based on a daily pick up (between 2.00 pm and 3.00 pm Mon- Fri) as per below, the other is our normal service provision which you will see later in the newsletter. Suzie will be working the weekend this week so you can order as required from Saturday morning. If we stay at Alert Level 3 you will need to order the complete weeks food by Sunday at 4.00pm.

#### Hello from the Nurses Niche

#### Hi everyone,

Gosh it's amazing how quickly things change. I am sure you were as shocked as I was when the Emergency Alert came though loudly on Saturday night. I have given up watching the news lately as it doesn't do me any good so I had no idea of the PMs press conference. Luckily I had done all I wanted to on the previous two days so I wasn't too put out but my hubbie had put something off thinking he would do it on Sunday. It brought to mind Benjamin Franklin's quote " Don't put off until tomorrow what you can do today".

In this crazy time we really do need to live for the moment and take each day as it comes but that can be challenging for us organised planners!

In this week's fun facts series I thought I would investigate fingernails. Did you know?....

- Fingernails separate primates from mammals.
- Human nails are made of keratin. This is the same protective protein that also makes up our hair. Due to the different arrangement of these keratin molecules nails are much tougher than hair.
- Nails are designed to protect our finger tips and toe tips as well as the surrounding tissue from external injuries.
- Men's fingernails grow faster than women's nails with an exception of when a woman is pregnant then they
  grow faster than men's. Your thumbnail grows the slowest and your middle fingernail faster than the other
  fingers, and the nails grow quicker on your dominant hand.
- Fingernails grow an average of 3.5mm/month compared to toenails which grow an average of 1.6mm/month. They grow faster in summer than in the winter.
- You may have heard that fingernails keep growing after death. This is myth. What is actually happening is an optical illusion caused by the retraction of the skin around the base of the nail as there is no fluids going into the tissues which makes the nail look like it has grown.
- Nail biting has a name ; Onychophagia. It is estimated that 20-30% of people bite their nails and nobody seems to know why! Biters can expose themselves to harmful bacteria that collects under the nails. Good reason to try to stop!
- Increasing your water intake can improve your nails. Another reason to stay well hydrated.
- Fingernails can reveal lung, heart and liver diseases, so if you notice any changes best to get these checked out with your GP.

Remember that the nursing service is running as usual at alert level 3. Please ring before you come to the clinic I for nonurgent enquires. Take care

Outside of the Navy, Rebecca is a professional singer and has experienced success both at home in New Zealand and abroad.

In 2016 she signed to Sony Music NZ and released her album titled "Poppies & Pohutukawa" which featured prominently in the New Zealand music charts.

Rebecca is a regular performer at All Blacks matches, her most recent appearance was 10th November 2018 at the historic test match against England at Twickenham on the eve of the Armistice centenary where she sung the New Zealand national anthem in front of 82,000.

Rebecca's recent album "Reverence" was released in November 2019 with the seal of approval from His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales. The band that features on the album is none other than "the band of the Welsh Guards".
