Her target has been the slightly older section of the village ... those who may need that little bit more help and encouragement to get themselves out of their units.


She set up the Sunday afternoon programme which is aimed particularly at the single resident who may welcome the invitation to participate.

Become qualified to teach the building of bird boxes up to NZCEA standard.


Served on the Residents Committee in a various roles.
