

Village Manager's Weekly Update

Fire Alarm System Testing – The annual testing of Fire Alarm System is due to occur on the 20th - 23rd April and the 27th and 28th of April. Hello from the Nurses Niche

Hi everyone, I have had a great response for the annual influenza vaccinations which we are holding <u>Thursday 22nd April</u>, with over 66 consent forms handed in already. These forms are available from outside the nurses clinic and once completed you can return them to the clinic or leave them at reception.

If you can complete a form before next Thursday, I can then give Phil and his team from Northcross Pharmacy an idea of how many people to expect. Having said this if you do decide last minute to have the vaccine here, no problems, I will have some blank forms available on the day. In order to create a flow of people rather than a rush here is the timetable to remind you when we would like you to arrive to make this run as smoothly as possible. Please remember you will be required to wait 20mins in the Lodge lounge area after your vaccination which will give you time to have a cup of tea or coffee and a catch-up with others who have had the vaccination.





Odette's latest walk has been Rosedale Park with lots of amazing trees.










We need more volunteer bakers please. Thank you so much to those who have volunteered already.


Please leave your baked biscuits on the serving table by 9.30am on the 25th. Thanks.

INCREDIBLE HULK NOW A THING OF BEAUTY

Alan Young, perfectionist that he is, has just finished final detailing of "Sea Settler" including replacing minute rivet heads among other tiny embellishments.

The Dinghy is now all coated in Epoxy Resin ready for sanding on the outside and detail sanding on the inside prior to undercoating with paint.







On the 18th January 2021 resident John Morris arrived with a 100 year old clinker built dinghy as a unique project and challenge for Settlers Blokes Shed to restore. Such vessels are very scarce these days and represent an era where all boats were made of wood by artisans. Gordon Morris created and built a mobile boat cradle so enthusiasts could help with the project on the Blokes Shed forecourt. Alan Young who has built wooden boats all his working life has the unique skills to transform this dinghy. This is time consuming but essential work to achieve the pristine finish needed from bare timber. The ultimate goal of the project is to perhaps auction an "as new" classic clinker dinghy designed by Logan as a collector's item with any proceeds destined for a charity of Settlers' choice.
