Daylight Saving






Work on the bund between the motorway and the western boundary of the village

Northern Corridor Improvements

The 2km direct link and underpass connecting SH1 to SH18, marking the completion of the Western Ring Route (WRR) on Auckland's North Shore opened on Monday 20 March. This new stretch of road provides a resilient alternative for travel through Auckland and connects the north with western and southern regions.

SH1 Nightworks Notifications

Nightworks are scheduled to be working near us on SH1 Northern Motorway, Tuesday 4 and Wednesday 5 April. Hours of work are typically between 8pm and 5am. If they are delayed by weather or unforeseen circumstances, work will roll to the next night.

They are laying the final layer of OGPA (open graded porous asphalt) at the northern extent of our project. These works must be carried out at night to reduce the impact and delays on daytime traffic. These are the last two asphalt shifts in our area.

Work has been carefully planned to keep disruption to a minimum; however, there will be some noise, heavy machinery and trucks moving. Road closures will be in place with detours signposted.

There are two different options available when considering the yearly influenza shot, firstly is the government funded for over 65's also known as the Afluria Quad which is free, secondly there is the Fluad Quad which offers more protection. Last day for signing up for the non-funded injection is the 5th of April 2023, it costs \$45.00 and is paid on the day. If you are unable to get it on the 13th of April, you also have the option to receive it from your GP. Thank you to those of you who have already signed the consent forms. It's still not too late! Feel free to grab a consent form from reception, sign it and hand it back into the nurses' station to secure your spot!

Gardening Update



Hello Everyone,

After a very busy first month, I thought it was time to write a little hello and give you an update about all the activities that the boys and I have been up to.

As most of you know, we have been very busy at the front gate. In previous years, this area has been our annual flower bed, but it was time for a change! We wanted to create a WOW entrance garden to greet all residents and visitors to Fairview. I know we had some confused looks at the start when we only had our 60-year-old pine railway sleepers in, while people tried to envision the end result. We have just completed our final stage of the design with our drip line irrigation system to water our little plant babies, and a nice thick layer of decorative bark to hide our irrigation and suppress weeds. Big thanks to the croquet players who were very patient with us working alongside the green whilst getting the irrigation sorted. It's an ongoing process but the end is in sight!

This week, you would have seen Dave, Hugh and Isaac working hard down Margaret Drive weeding away around our palms and front gardens. Weeding everyday isn't the nicest of jobs, so it's greatly appreciated, and it looks great! Once we get to the end of Margaret Drive, we will then move down each road to start weeding the fronts of gardens starting from Ash and finishing at Poppy.

Throughout today and tomorrow, we will also be following along behind the team with spray. Signs will be placed at the front of the village alerting visitors that spraying is in process. Staff spraying will be wearing PPE so we might look a little scary with our masks on, but it's just to protect ourselves.

Next week is shaping up to be another busy week for the gardening department. We have Ashdown Landscapes here for the next few days clearing debris of the Motorway Bund and going into next week, Mulch man is here on Wednesday 5/04/2023 and will be spraying the bund towards the far end of the village. Because of this we do ask that we keep the below roads clear of cars and ask for your patience throughout the day while the large trucks are here. Dahlia Drive, Elm Haven, Fuchsia Lane, Gardenia Grove, Hibiscus Crescent: Access may be limited throughout the day in and out of these roads.

It has been all systems go for the boys and I over the last month and I'm very grateful that they have been patient with me while I get new systems in place and change a few things around. I'm currently working on rotations so that all residents will be able to get hedge trimming, spraying, weeding, pruning done on a more regular basis and there will be minimal need for maintenance requests.

We are currently facing a very large backlog of maintenance requests that we are chipping away at while still completing our weekly tasks and duties. For the next few weeks, it would be a huge help if we refrain from submitting maintenance requests unless it's emergency work. We are doing our very best to get systems underway as soon as possible.

Within the next few weeks, there will be an update of all scheduled work so that each Villa/Area will get looked after and we hope that everyone here at Fairview will be able to see when and where jobs will be completed and to what timeframe.

Unfortunately, we will say goodbye to Ben next Thursday 6th April. Ben has been a huge asset to the gardening team and will be very missed by myself and the team. We are currently hiring to fill the position and interviews are ongoing.

Thank you to everyone who's stopped to say Hello and introduce themselves to me. Everyone has made me feel very welcome and it's really helped me settle in, especial café staff...! Thanks for fueling me on coffee!!
