Just a reminder how to access the visitors' entry using the gate phone. The gate phone is in the central plinth on the driver's side of the entryway. The driver of the vehicle carries out the instructions by the phone which rings the resident by phoning the residents villa' or apartment number, prefixed by the figure "0" to make up a three-digit group;

Villa 103 = V103 Apartment 402 = A402, Villa 9 = V009 Townhouse 140A = T140A. Villa 61 = V061

Once the resident has verified the authenticity of their visitor, the resident presses "9" on the home phone keypad and hangs up and the entry gate will open.
