Recipe of the Month

Just lately, I've had a craving for New Zealand mussels. I like mussels so much, I have them for dinner every other day, meaning 4 times a week! I like to cook them in 4 different ways such as mussel soup, in a stir-fry, and either grilled or steamed mussels. The recipe I will share this month is my mussels soup which is perfect for the winter season.



Did you know that mussels are high in protein and are heart-healthy with omega-3 fatty acids, selenium and iodine? They are relatively low in calories and fat and have exceptional nutritional value. Omega-3 are the 'good oils' that are beneficial for the heart by helping lower cholesterol and has anti-inflammatory properties. Selenium is an antioxidant compound that fights free radicals in the blood stream. Iodine is essential for natural production of thyroid hormones that contribute to basic metabolism as well as helping your body to efficiently burn calories.

Ingredients:

- 2 tbsp of olive oil
- 2 cloves of garlic
- 1 small red onion
- 1 thumb size of ginger crushed and sliced
- 2 pc of dices tomatoes
- 1 cup of water
- 1 kg of mussels (cleaned & rubbed)
- 1 tbsp of fish sauce
- 3 green chillies (optional)
- Some greens such as baby spinach or Bok choy
- Salt and pepper to taste

Procedures:

- Heat your saucepan with olive oil.
- Cook the garlic, onion, ginger and tomatoes for 2-3 mins.
- Add the mussels and cover with a lid.
- Simmer for 3-5 mins or until they are opened.
- Add water, seasoned with salt & pepper, chillies and some greens.
- Serve hot!!!



SUMMARY OF DECISIONS MADE AT RESIDENTS' COMMITTEE MEETING JULY 2023

To assist residents to be informed of decisions made by the Residents' Committee, below is a summary of matters following our meeting of the 11th July 2023. Full minutes will be available in the library following the confirmation of the minutes at the next monthly meeting.

FINANCIAL POSITION

The balance in the account as at 9th July 2023 is \$1,936.05. The amount on fixed deposit is \$10,000.

GENERAL

- Strength and Balance: A number of people would like an extra class. Management will fund the Monday session only. Benjamin put forward a proposal that a class by a fitness instructor from Albany Stadium seemed good value for money. The committee agreed to subsidise the cost of this class on a trial basis.
- Bingo Night Proposal: A proposal to trial a series of Bingo evenings similar to those run by Settlers was put forward. They would be held on the first Saturday of each month and run from September to December. The committee agreed to put forward a sum of \$500 to start up this initiative.
- A Tai Chi instructor has been found and will start immediately on Tuesday afternoons. The committee agreed to subsidise the payment for the instructor on a similar basis to Yoga.
- The committee agreed to pay for new balls for the croquet club.
- Health and Safety: A list of lights not working as well as street markings deemed necessary was handed to Terry. Many of these lights have not been working for some considerable time. The committee was pleased that the rubbish opposite the petrol station has finally been cleared up.
- Another health issue was the underfloor heating in the 2nd floor lounge which is left on all the time. It appears that the changing sheds are governed by the same system. Several exercise classes held in the lounge area are <u>not</u> enjoying the heat. It was agreed to turn the heating off and have separate heaters in the changing sheds.

The next meeting will be on 8th August at 10.00 am.
