## From the CEO's Desk

As Marika is away on Conference this week I have the honour of writing the weekly update.

Thanks to Cherie, Nicki and the front desk team at Fairview for holding the fort whilst Marika is away.

Marika and I met with your Residents Committee Chairman last week as we were not able to attend the meeting last Tuesday and I advised him that the Owners have made the decision to review the length of time we charge weekly fees when a resident leaves the village. With immediate effect we have brought this down to a period of 3 months after we receive vacant possession. This comes into play with immediate effect and on Marika's return we will be writing to you personally to advise you of this decision. A copy of that letter will be included with your ORA on file as it represents a change to the terms of your ORA.


I also discussed some of the risks around parking and charging of electric vehicles, especially in the basement, villa and townhouse car parks with the main risk being fire associated with lithium batteries. With this in mind, we will be writing a policy around charging and parking of EV Vehicles and Mobility Scooters at Fairview. As this will be a new policy, we will consult with all residents first before we make an informed decision. I have asked your committee to volunteer two residents to form part of a working group to assist us in the review.

Caitlin is away for a month on leave starting Friday next week. Cailtin and Marika will circulate a letter to you all next week reminding you of the recently agreed procedures in respect to gardening requests and how the gardens will be managed whilst Caitlin is away.

A resource application has been made with council for permission to cut down the overgrown trees at the front entrance and we will keep you all updated on progress.


Hello Everyone,


