#### **Christmas' Project for December**



Welcome back to another week of the Nurses' Corner.

To open, I am wanting to do a manual check of the Nurse Call points in every Villa & Apartment as well as Pendants. This is to make sure that all the call points are working correctly should they need to be used. I am proposing the call point checks start from the week of the 25<sup>th</sup> of September 2023 beginning with **Ash Avenue, Beech Way, & Cherry Hill**. I will be hoping to do these checks between 10am and 11.30am Monday to Friday depending on how long it takes. I will let subsequent streets know when I will be coming by to do these checks. For Nurse Call Pendants, if you are going to be out of the village if you leave your pendant on the table, I will test it to see if it works then.

Given the significant number of call points to test across the village, I aim to complete this over the next few weeks to months. To aid in speeding this up, I will access the Villas or Apartments by knocking first, if there is no answer and you have indicated previously it is okay to access your villa or apartment without you being present, I will let myself in, test the call points and leave a card on your kitchen to let you know I have been by. If there are any residents who wish to be excluded from this check or need to be present while I am checking their call points, please let me know by phoning myself directly on 021 861 706 and I will organise a time with you for this.

**Dancercise with Libby:** Thank you to those who keep turning out! She will be back in again this Thursday for a 1045am start. This is a similar style class that focuses on building up strength, balance, & coordination, all of which are key to maintaining your overall wellbeing. #### **NEW BOOKS**

**The Axeman's Carnival by Catherine Chidgey** - Everywhere, the birds: sparrows and skylarks and thrushes, starlings and bellbirds, fantails and pipits - but above them all and louder, the magpies. We are here and this is our tree and we're staying and it is ours and you need to leave and now!

**The Other Side of Mrs Wood by Lucy Barker** - A deliciously atmospheric historical novel about the rivalry between two female mediums during Victorian London's obsession with Spiritualism. Violet Wood accepts an apprentice, Miss Bird. But is Miss Bird all that she seems?

All the Broken Places by John Boyne - A devastatingly beautiful story about a woman who must confront the sins of her own terrible past, and a present in which it is never too late for bravery. Sequel to 'The Boy in Striped Pyjamas'.

**Killing Moon by Jo Nesbo** - Time is running out! Two young women are missing, their only connection a party they both attended, hosted by a notorious real-estate magnate. When one of the women is found murdered, the police discover an unusual signature left by the killer, giving them reason to suspect he will strike again.

**State of Terror by Hillary Rodham Clinton and Louise Penney** - A series of terrorist attacks throws the global order into disarray, and the Secretary of State is tasked with assembling a team to unravel the deadly conspiracy, a scheme carefully designed to take advantage of an American government dangerously out of touch and out of power in the places where it counts the most.

When God Was a Rabbit by Sarah Winman - Spanning four decades, from 1968 onwards, this is the story of a fabulous but flawed family and the slew of ordinary and extraordinary incidents that shape their everyday lives. Stripped down to its bare bones, it's about the unbreakable bond between a brother and sister.

**In her Blood by Nikki Crutchley** - Two missing girls, two decades apart. Only one person knows the truth ... Moody and atmospheric, a tense and twisting story that crackles off the page.

**Still Life by Sarah Winman** - With beautiful prose, extraordinary tenderness, and bursts of humour and light, *Still Life* is a sweeping portrait of unforgettable individuals who come together to make a family, and a richly drawn celebration of beauty and love in all its forms.

**The Covenant of Water by Abraham Verghese** - An expansive, multi-generational tale of an Indian family whose members all suffer from what is termed the "Condition." From the story's opening in 1900 to its close in 1977, this Condition leads to the death by drowning of many members of the family, usually male. Other members of the family become physicians. It's a hymn to progress in medicine and to human understanding.
