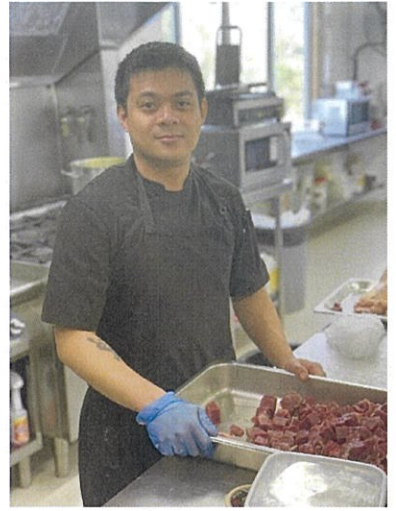

Recipe of the Month: Courgette and Corn Fritters

This week we sold three major raffles and two minor.

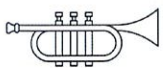
The dwelling draw was undertaken by Adele Marshall, a visitor to the village and the winner was Natasha Nevill. Congratulations Natasha.

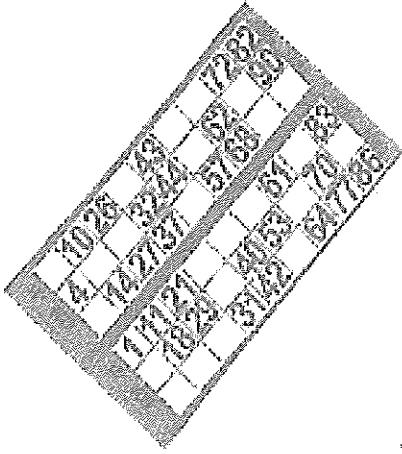

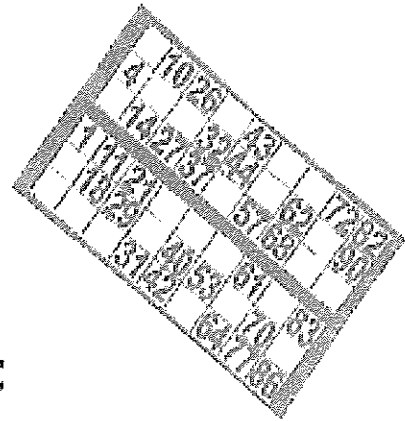
