Nurses' corner

Hello Everyone,

Welcome back to another week of the Nurses Corner.

Coming into the holiday season, I would like to start out by reminding residents of the importance of letting us know about their travel plans and more specifically when they will be away from their Villas or Apartments.

Secondly, during this time of the year we typically see an increase in the number of scams. It is important to remember the golden rule, if its sounds too good to be true, it probably is. If you are unsure about any communications you receive, or if you feel like you are being scammed, please get in touch. There is a good article about the different types of scams which I will have some printed copies of down by my office.

As mentioned, the last few weeks, I am wanting to do a manual check of the Nurse Call points in every Villa & Apartment as well as Pendants. Thus far all the call points are working as they are supposed to. The next group of call points I will test next week beginning the 13th of November is **Olive Grove & Poppy Vale.** I will be hoping to do these checks between 10am and 11.30am Monday to Friday depending on how long it takes. Typically, I do these checks on the Fridays of the week nominated. I will let subsequent streets know when I will be coming by to do these checks. For Nurse Call Pendants, if you are going to be out of the village if you leave your pendant on the table, I will test it to see if it works then.

Given the significant number of call points to test across the village, I aim to complete this over the next few weeks to months. To aid in speeding this up, I will access the Villas or Apartments by knocking first, if there is no answer and you have indicated previously it is okay to access your villa or apartment without you being present, I will let myself in, test the call points and leave a card to let you know I have been by. If there are any residents who wish to be excluded from this check or need to be present while I am checking their call points, please let me know by phoning myself directly on 021 861 706 and I will organise a time with you for this.

AFTER HOURS ENTRY GATE AND PEDESTRIAN GATE

Visitor Entry Using the Gate Phone

- The gate phone is in the central plinth on the driver's side of the entryway.
- The driver of the vehicle carries out the instructions by the phone which rings the resident by phoning the residents villa or apartment number prefixed by the figure "0" to make up a three-digit group; i.e. villa 103 = "V103", villa 9 = "V009", villa 61 = "V061", apartment 402 = "A402".
- Once the resident has verified the authenticity of their visitor, the resident presses "9" on the home phone keypad, an audible "thunk" will sound and the entry gate will open.

Entry/Exit Using the Pedestrian Gate

- The pedestrian gate is locked at the same time as the main gates.
- To enter or exit the village through the pedestrian gate enter the code 2033# on the keypad at the pedestrian gate, there will be an audible "thunk" and the gate will unlock.
- The gate will automatically lock on closure.


Easy Peasy Picnic Party – Sunday 19th November at 2.00pm

Follow up from the Questionnaire from the RV/Residents Association

RETIREMENT VILLAGES ACT REVIEW WORKSHOP - TAKAPUNA 02/11/23

- The 2003 Retirement Villages Act protects the interests of residents and intending residents and provides a framework for regulating and monitoring operators.
- Why the review of the 2003 Act?

Because;

- The Retirement Commissioner's White Paper.
- ii) Consumer protection issues raised by Consumer New Zealand and various Parliamentary petitions.
- iii) The Sector needs to be able to respond to future demands.
- iv) The need for good regulatory stewardship is the Act still 'fit for purpose?'

Objectives for the review of the 2003 Act. The Legislative framework should ensure;

- i) Adequate consumer protection.
- ii) Effective balance of rights and responsibilities of residents and operators.
- iii) Appropriately defined rights and responsibilities of owners and residents.

The scope of the review and the discussion covers three main areas;

Moving in – Living in – Moving out.

• The main proposals within the review.

Moving in:

- a) Simplicity of both the disclosure statement and the right to occupy agreement.
- b) Improve consumer protection by strengthening the regulatory tools.

Living in:

- a) A new independent dispute resolution process.
- b) A requirement that operators meet the costs of the repair and maintenance of chattels.
- c) Information on aged care provisions in retirement villages.

Moving out:

- a) Mandatory repayment time framework.
- b) Requirement that operators pay interest on unpaid capital soon after an apartment/villa is vacated
- c) Stopping monthly fees when apartment/villa is vacated.
- d) Stopping fixed deductions.
- e) Requiring liability for capital loss.

The process for a Bill being presented to Parliament.

Step one – a submission period.

Step two – submissions are analysed by the Ministry of Housing and Urban Development.

Step three – The MHUD officials advise the Minister.

Step four - Cabinet agrees to new policy.

Step five – A Bill is drafted.

Step six - Cabinet approves the new Bill.

Step seven – the Bill is introduced to Parliament.

The process once a Bill is introduced to the House.

Step one – the Bill is introduced and there is the first reading of the Bill.

Step two – the Bill is then sent to a Select Committee, where oral submissions can be received.

Step three – the Bill is given its second reading.

Step four – the Bill comes before a Committee of the whole of the House.

Step five – the Bill is given its third reading.

Step six – Royal Assent – The Governor General signs the Bill into Law, this becoming a Parliamentary Act.
