### Oil disposal for residents

Unfortunately, we had to remove the food scraps bin on Level 3 in the Laundry Room as we were having issues with maggots in the bins. We are very sorry for the inconvenience. Food scrap bins are still available in the Laundry Level 4 outside on the balcony.

Also, please take note that our waste management contractor collects mixed recycling at once, it is not separated. Polystyrene (e.g., from packaging) is not a recycling item. You can place this in the general waste bin. We are having issues where our waste management contractor doesn't collect our recycling bins when polystyrene or other non-recycling items are in the bins.

Following a resident asking me about oil disposal for residents, I am pleased to confirm we can offer this service via our Kitchen team. Please bring your oil container on Wednesdays, before 12pm to Relish Café. It is compulsory for your oil container to have a secure lid and in a container that can easily be poured out into barrels from our contractor (bucket, 20L container, are generally the best).

Please take note that our contractor will be in the Lodge Lounge on Friday 8<sup>th</sup> December to clean the carpet. Their staff will be moving furniture as they clean each area of the lounge and dining room.

# Food Scraps bins

# What you can put in your bin

- Fruit and vegetable scraps, peelings, cores, stalks and skin.
- Bread, pasta and rice.
- Dairy products.
- Meat bones and scraps, including fat trimmings.
- Fish bones and scraps, including shellfish shells.
- Eggshells, nut shells and coconut husks.
- Coffee grounds and tea leaves.
- Fats/oils solidified (if possible).
- Indoor cut flowers.

# What to do on rubbish collection day?

### Villa residents

Please place your green food scrap bin by the side of the road, next to your rubbish and recycling, every Monday morning for the gardening team to collect. Please ensure that your *pink liner bags are tied inside*. Leave the handle up to lock the bin lid in place and also make it easy for the collector to pick the bin up - if the handle doesn't lock properly, try pressing down on the lid.

# Apartment residents

Please place your <u>tied pink food scrap liners</u> in the small green food scrap bin in the laundry room on Level 4. They will be collected every morning Monday to Friday. We recommend emptying your caddy daily or freezing your food scraps before placing them in the food scrap bin.

# Our tips

- Compulsory pink liners are to be used in your kitchen caddy at Fairview as the rubbish collection is done by our gardeners and will help them to keep things tidy.
- You can <u>freeze</u> your food scraps until collection day to avoid any insects.
- Use paper to line your kitchen caddy to help soak up any liquids.
- Leave your kitchen caddy in the kitchen do not take it out for collection.
- We recommend cleaning your kitchen caddy and green bin weekly.
- If you don't use your kitchen caddy or green bin, please store it safely in your unit. Each bin belongs to the unit and is to be left on termination.



# What you cannot put in bin

- Plastic bags.
- Disposable food containers (including compostable items).
- Food wrapping, including cling film, waxed paper or aluminum foil.
  - Cloth and clothing.
- Nappies and sanitary products.
- Pet waste.
- Liquids or chemicals.
- Cigarette butts.
- Soil or rocks.
- Garden waste like weeds, lawn clippings or hedge trimmings.
