The system is set up in such a way that when a text is sent, it can come from any of 10 phone numbers allocated to our system. You will always

in your phone (Fairview text) so any future texts are easily identifiable and not thought to be a scam.

We are off to another busy week for us with Villa refurbishments, hedge trimming, and our Villa circuits. This last week, we have been brainstorming different ways to effectively work with each other to accomplish as much as we can during the day. Currently we have split off into our own areas and tasks to see if we can get more done in a bigger variety of areas.

Hugh is chipping away at some of our refurbishments by removing overgrown or unwell plants, clearing out areas to open them up creating more light, and getting rid of those nasty weeds. We all really enjoy refurbs as we use our creative freedom to design and plan the future look of the Villa and watch our imagination come to life.

Recipe of the month - Braised Short Ribs



Yield:

2-4 portions, good for sharing

Ingredients:

1 kg beef short ribs or any beef on bones

1 pc large carrot diced

1 large white onion sliced

1 stalk celery

3 pcs bay leaf

1 beer bottle (I used Speights dark ale)

3 cups water

Salt and pepper, fresh thyme

For the rue: 100 gms butter, 100 gms flour

Procedures:

- 1. Season the beef ribs with salt, pepper, thyme.
- 2. Sear the beef in a Teflon pan until all sides are brown.
- 3. In a baking pan, place the beed and add the rest of ingredients.
- 4. Cover with foil and bake for 170 degrees for 3 hours.
- 5. Once cooked, prepare a rue. In a small pot, mix flour and butter until cooked, then add in some of the jus. Continue adding until you reach your desired thickness of gravy.
- 6. Serve with your favourite mashed potatoes, vegetables or even a simple roast tomato.
- 7. Enjoy!


