Recipe of the Month

Relish Thai Beef Salad

Thai beef salad, known as Yam Nua, is a vibrant dish that captures the essence of Thai cuisine - freshness, balance, and bold flavours. Originating from the northern regions of Thailand, this salad is a delightful blend of marinated beef, crisp vegetables, and a zesty dressing that brings everything together. It's often enjoyed as a refreshing meal, especially in the warmer months, and is perfect for gatherings with friends or family. A few months ago, we served this Thai beef salad as our Chef's special lunch. It was one of the most popular lunch dishes we ever had. Many of you were asking me for the recipe. I know there are thousands of recipes on the internet, but our one is unique, easy and simple and most of all, it's made with love. We are happy to share the recipe with you all!



Ingredients:

Serves 3-4

For the beef:

500 grams – thin slices of sirloin ½ cup sweet chilli sauce ½ cup soy sauce

Dressing:

2 tbsp sesame oil
2 tbsp olive oil
1 tbsp sugar dissolve in ¼ cup hot water
1 whole lime juice and rind (or lemon)
Salt and pepper
1 thumb size crushed/grated ginger
Dash of chili flakes (optional)
1 tbsp fish sauce (optional)
1 tsp toasted black and white sesame seeds
Some chopped coriander

For salad:

Tomatoes, cucumber, red onion, salad of your choice (mesclun, baby spinach, cos lettuce)

Procedure:

- 1. Marinate the beef for at least 1 hour.
- 2. Sauté the beef with little oil until it is cooked to your liking (rare, medium or well done).
- 3. Mix all ingredients for the dressing. Set aside.
- 4. Mix your salad and vegetables, depending on your preferences I used, mesclun, tomato, red onion and cucumber. You can add mung beans, noodles and more.
- 4. Toss the salad, beef and dressing.
- 5. Enjoy! 😊
