From the Manager's desk

Update on painting of villa roofs

You may have noticed that the roofs' cleaning did not start earlier this week as planned. Platinum Painters will now be using a quick release chemical, which will not require the initial 3 weeks waiting period. Therefore, cleaning of the Stage 1 villa roofs will likely commence mid-November. We should be able to confirm the start date and schedule next week.

Once the process starts, day 1 will be the cleaning of the roofs, day 2 will be for the repairs, and day 3 should be for the painting, if all repairs were completed the day prior. We will liaise with residents in advance so you can expect when the scaffolding will be set up at your villa. Scaffolding, repairs, and painting should take approximately up to 5 days to complete per villa. We will always do our best to inform residents ahead of time when the painters will be visiting their villa next, weather dependent.

Following questions from residents, here is

some more information:

- Platinum Painters will work per individual villa or per block of attached villas.
- Edge protection scaffolding will be erected so we recommend moving outside furniture and pot plants.
- If you park your car outside, we recommend moving your car when the painting will take place.
- If there is any vegetation in your gutters, it will be removed as part of the process.

Stage 1 will be for the villas on the streets below and will be proceeding in numerical order:

- Ash Avenue (3-5),
- Beech Way (6-14),
- Cherry Hill (16-24),
- Magnolia Terrace (120-125/128/130-133),
- Ngaio Lane (136-138/143-145),
- Poppy Vale (135/142/147)
- Olive Grove (146 only)




Save the date - Market Day 21st November
