Join me in welcoming our newest resident Philippa Verrell who moved in to Villa 87 yesterday. Welcome home and we are sure you will love your new community as much as we do, we are looking forward to seeing you around in the Village.

Update on painting of villa roofs

Platinum Painters is waiting on the delivery of the edge protection, and this has been postponed to the middle of next week. This will delay them with the original start date of Monday 11th November at unit 138, which will now be towards the end of next week. As this villa is vacant at the moment, it will be our first villa as a trial, and it should take between 3 to 5 days to complete. Following this, Platinum Painters will move to the block of villas 3-4-5, requiring a week for those, and carrying on this way. We should be able to confirm the rest of the schedule as we go after this. We will liaise with residents in advance so you can expect when the edge protection will be set up at your villa and know when to move your pots, cars or other items if need be. Edge protection, repairs, and painting should take approximately up to 5 days to complete per villa. Please let me know if you have any questions or concerns.
