Painting of villa roofs update

Platinum Painters is scheduled to start the work at villa 138 today. Edge protection will be erected, and the repairs and painting of the roof should be completed by the end of next week. We will liaise with residents in advance so you can expect when the edge protection will be set up at your villa and know when to move pots, cars or other items if need be. Happy Tuesday 2 for 1 dine in deals in 2025

We hope you enjoyed our last Happy Tuesday 2 for 1 dine in deal for the year. These special monthly events will resume in February 2025. For us to be able to keep our 2 for 1 offer at a low cost, we have reviewed a few points for next year.

- Bookings will be strictly limited to 76 people, which is the number of seats we have daily in the dining room without having to move tables and adding chairs. Otherwise, we have been needing to get our gardeners involved for the room set up which occurs additional cost to our event.
- Bookings and payments will be done at Reception.
- There will be no seating plan or tables reserved. Residents who come first can choose their preferred table. Booking sheet will be to take names and payments only.
- We will specify when the bookings are opening (date and time) to ensure everyone has the same chance to book. Residents will be able to put their name down on our waiting list if fully booked.

Please take note that delivery days have changed to Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

Reminder for the Swimming Pool

A kind reminder to ask residents to keep the doors and windows closed in the swimming pool area. When open, condensation is created and windows/doors are needing to be cleaned more regularly due to streaks, as well as letting bugs in and having cobwebs inside and outside. The swimming pool area is heated to a certain temperature to keep the swimming pool at a certain temperature, not affecting peaks in electricity demand tyring to heat the room and the pool otherwise. We also recommend wearing jandals when walking in the pool area and in the changing room for your own personal hygiene.

Reminder when ordering taxis

When booking a taxi, please ensure you mention your villa or apartment number, or to meet at the Lodge. We have had recent situations where the taxi drivers did not pick up residents on time as they were looking around the village or waiting outside villa 21. If you are waiting for a taxi which is late, you can report to reception as we sometimes are aware of a taxi waiting somewhere but we don't know for who, or vice versa.

Staying Safe from Scams and Opportunists During the Holiday Season

As we enter the festive season, it's a joyful time filled with gatherings, giving, and celebrations. Unfortunately, it's also a time when scammers and opportunists try to take advantage of the holiday spirit. Whether it's online fraud, phone scams, or doorstep trickery, these individuals often prey on the goodwill of others, particularly during the busy holiday period. Being aware of common scams and staying vigilant can help us enjoy a safe and peaceful season.

Common Scams to Watch Out For

Phone Scams: Callers might pretend to be from trusted companies (like banks or power companies) and ask for personal information. Remember, reputable companies will never request sensitive information over the phone.

Online Scams: Watch out for emails or websites that look like familiar retailers but ask for unusual information. Always go directly to the official website rather than clicking on links in unsolicited emails.
