Respecting and Supporting People with Disabilities

At Fairview, we are a community built on kindness, understanding, and respect for one another. It's important to remember that not all disabilities are visible, and we may not always know the challenges someone is facing. Disabilities can include hearing loss, eyesight impairment, mobility issues, speech difficulties, or cognitive challenges, among others.

A Gentle Reminder: Not All Disabilities Are Visible

Sometimes, we may interact with someone who struggles to hear, see, or speak clearly, and it's easy to become frustrated without realizing what they may be experiencing. Before making assumptions, take a moment to pause, show patience, and be understanding. No one should have to explain their situation to complete strangers.

How We Can Be Supportive

- **Be Patient**: If someone doesn't respond right away, it may be due to hearing loss, speech difficulty, or cognitive delays. Give them time and remain calm.
- **Speak Clearly, Not Loudly**: If someone has hearing impairment, raising your voice may not help. Speak clearly, slowly, and face them so they can see your mouth.
- **Be Considerate**: If someone doesn't understand you, don't walk away muttering that they're "stupid" or dismissing them. Perhaps they are deaf, visually impaired, or struggling with speech—situations that require compassion, not judgment.
- Offer Help Without Assumption: If you see someone struggling, kindly offer help but don't assume what they need. Respect their dignity and choice.

How Would You Feel?

Take a moment to reflect: How would you feel if you weren't welcomed, dismissed, or made to feel "different" in your own community? A little kindness goes a long way. We all deserve to feel included, respected, and understood.

Always Be Kind and Humble

The golden rule remains treat others how you would like to be treated. Be open-minded and supportive, and never underestimate the impact of a smile, a kind word, or a little extra patience.

At Fairview, let's continue to build an environment where everyone feels welcome, valued, and cared for—regardless of ability or circumstance. After all, kindness costs nothing but means everything.


