NEW BOOKS

A Very French Affair by Maria Hoyle (NZ) - What do you say when a man you've dated a handful of times asks you to go live with him in a mill by a river in France? The obvious answer is: 'Are you out of your mind?' Maria Hoyle's was: 'Okay.' At the age of 63 she left her life in Auckland - her two daughters, her dog, her friends, a beautiful rental by a beach, and everything she'd loved for more than two decades - to settle in a tiny French village with a partner she barely knew. The Lion Women of Tehran by Marian Kamala - A heartfelt, epic novel of friendship, betrayal, and redemption set against three transformative decades in Tehran, Iran. Two young girls, Ellie and Homa share a wonderful friendship. Together, the two young women come of age and pursue their own goals for meaningful futures.
