Intranet access

As many residents may be aware there is a section of the Fairview website that is for residents to access for things like menus, phone books etc. We are currently doing some work in the background on this area and will shortly advise how residents can access this if they are not already aware.

Charges for services

We have reviewed our current charges and costs and will be making the following adjustments from the 1st of April 2025.

Staff charge out rates for housekeeping, maintenance and gardening for personal requests will increase from \$39.00 per hour to \$42.00 per hour.

Dinner pricing will increase from the current \$18.00 and \$20.00 to \$19.00 and \$21.00. The lunch menu will be updated in terms of price and selection; cabinet pricing will be reviewed on an individual basis.

Health and Wellbeing Corner



Hello All,

Lovely to see so many smiling faces around the place.

Makes getting up at 0630am bearable so please keep giving.

Flu vaccinations

Thank you to those residents that have returned your forms.

A slight hiccup – some of you might prefer the non-funded vaccine which has a charge and we only sent out consents for the funded vaccine.

If you would like the non-funded vaccine then please let us know, in person or by phone so we know the right numbers on the day.

The funded vaccination is perfect for all of us. It is used for all ages over 6 months and is recommended for those over 65.

The non funded vaccine is slightly stronger in that it has an ingredient that will boost the immune response. This vaccine is for those that are more likely to get chest infections. If in doubt as to what you should receive then consult your doctor. This vaccine is usually between \$40 - \$50.

If you are prone to getting pneumonia or bacterial infections then your doctor may have advised you to get the Pneumococcal vaccination as well. This will only be available through your GP. All vaccination sheets to be back by Friday the 28th of March. We will not be accepting any after that and unfortunately if you turn up on the day for a vaccination and you haven't signed a consent, we will not be able to accommodate you.

Vaccines must be strictly monitored for temperature, so numbers must be precise when taken from a fridge and transported.

Safety

Just one that pops up from time to time and being here 24/7 the nurses are often the first responders to smoke alarms.

In an apartment - If you have set off a smoke alarm by accident while making toast or burning the steak please keep your door closed.

We do not want smoke to go into the hallway. Open all outfacing windows and sliding doors and then (flail) around with a tea towel under your smoke alarm to move the air around.

The nurse will come to you and help you. If anyone comes to see what is happening and opens the door, please ask them to shut it.

Independence

I will touch on this in more depth next week, but it was one that Mizzy the lovely head nurse at Settlers and I talked about.

Remember independence is also about asking for help before that help is too late.

To keep independent many of us need some assistance. Ageing in place – that is, the place you want to age in, is a key priority and to do that I will give some tips next week as to how we can best help ourselves.

FINANCIAL POSITION

The balance in the account as at 10 March 2025 is \$11,184.55.

GENERAL

- House and Grounds:
 - Gary was thanked for his prompt attendance to last month's issues but it was noted the pavement access by the pedestrian crossing at Beech/Margaret has still not been addressed. There are further lights recorded as not working.
- Bar Liaison: Following a short closure of the bar a temporary license has been granted thanks to Mark Jennins. Gary suggested the committee have a dedicated email address to ensure a similar lapse does not happen in the future.
- A point about heat pumps and double glazing not being standardized in every villa and apartment was raised. This matter needs to be discussed with management.
- EV vehicles: A question about whether installing a charger for electric vehicles would be value for money was discussed. No future residents will be allowed to bring electric vehicles to the village, and the current owners are few and may decide not to use the village charger at extra cost.
- The date for the Residents' Association AGM has been set for the 6th May at 10.00 am.


