Come on down and see this incredible piece of equipment in action — I'll demonstrate how it can lift someone up from almost anywhere! (Though head-down in the garden is still a bit tricky!) For those that are new you may find this very reassuring. No ambulance call needed. I will be in the 3rd floor lounge on Monday 12th May at 11.30 after Strength and Balance.

Appointments

This system has been working really well for us—it helps us keep track of who we're seeing and when. However, we are always available for you. We understand that pain, skin tears, or the need for advice don't always follow a schedule. If possible, give us a call first—but you're always welcome to drop in.

Skin Care

Heading into winter, skin can often become dry and as skin ages there are certainly things you can do to protect it which don't cost the earth.

- Don't over wash and don't over exfoliate as your skin gets thinner and your top layer of skin has less collagen and elastin it will lose its bounce coupled with a thinner subcutaneous fat layer there is less protection so harsh scrubbing and over washing can result in dryness and bruising.
- Don't use too many oils this can result in a slippery base to the shower or floor Health and Safety first.
- Do continue to use sunscreen even on the overcast days.
- Use a silk pillowcase. Old dead skin adheres to cotton and flannel so this can cause irritation and bacteria to your face.
- Do have required fluids and a healthy nutritious diet
- Do moisturise daily and more often if you think of it. This can decrease skin tears and friction.
- Manage stress.
- Get regular skin checks.
