Health and Wellbeing Corner

Hello All,

Heat Stroke

Heat Stroke is a serious medical emergency, particularly for the elderly. Elderly bodies are less likely to be able to regulate temperature and adapt. The bodies temperature can rise rapidly and while you may be thinking I am getting a bit hot here the process of heat stroke is already underway. With limited mobility, chronic health conditions, medications that interfere with the body's ability to regulate temperature, increased risk of dehydration due to diuretics, limited mobility, lack of support and delayed access to help the body can become overwhelmed very quickly.

Signs of heat stroke are:

- Confusion, disorientation
- Red and hot
- Rapid, strong pulse
- Headache, dizziness, nausea and vomiting
- Muscle cramps and weakness
- Rapid breathing

Seizures

If you see someone that is sitting in the sun and you suspect they may have fallen asleep please ask them if they are alright, if you shake their shoulder gently and get no response please ring for the nurse, or any help nearby.

Get them into shade, lift their head up if their head has fallen forward.

Sprinkle cold water on them, if conscious give them sips of cold water.

Fan them

Apply cold compresses to neck

If layered clothing – remove

My rule of thumb is, if you wouldn't put a baby in that sun and leave them there then don't sit in it yourself. Look for shade.

Book a doctor

Health New Zealand understand that sometimes sitting in a crowded Clinic, going to A&E or not being able to get a doctor's appointment for days and sometimes longer becomes overwhelming for someone who is unwell and vulnerable, so they have started book a doctor.

This service is for non-urgent care such as coughs, colds, flu, rashes, stomach bugs, minor allergies, prescriptions etc.

To use this service, you will need a smart phone or a tablet, and possibly a support person to help. Go to Health New Zealand website.

Scroll down and you will see Online GP Care.

Click on book an Online GP Care appointment now.

The next page you have a selection of providers that you can click on such as White Cross, Care HQ etc.

Click on one of these and follow instructions.

Fees can range from \$30.00 to \$70.00 depending on community care cards etc.

A very good service I think to keep people in their own homes when sick.

Chef Lunch Special for Month of July

Mexican Beef Nachos. Dive into a mouthwatering mountain of homemade beef mince, perfectly seasoned and served on a bed of golden cheese corn chips. Topped with a dollop of sour cream, jalapeños, and a drizzle of sweet chili sauce for the ultimate flavour kick. Only available this July – don't miss out!

Chef's Traditional muffin recipe Classic Blueberry Muffins (Makes 12) Ingredients:

- 1 ½ cups (190g) all-purpose flour
- ³/₄ cup (150g) granulated sugar
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 2 tsp baking powder
- ¹/₃ cup (80ml) vegetable oil
- 1 large egg
- $\frac{1}{3} \frac{1}{2} \exp(80 120 \text{ ml})$ milk (adjust to consistency)
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 1 cup (150g) fresh or frozen blueberries
- Optional: 1–2 tbsp flour (to coat berries if using frozen)

• Topping (optional but recommended):

- 2 tbsp sugar
- ¹/₂ tsp cinnamon

Instructions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 400°F (200°C). Line a 12-cup muffin tin with paper liners or lightly grease.
- 2. In a large bowl, whisk together flour, sugar, salt, and baking powder.
- 3. In a measuring cup or separate bowl, combine the oil, egg, vanilla, and milk. Add the wet mixture to the dry ingredients and stir just until combined. Don't overmix.
- 4. Fold in the blueberries gently. If using frozen berries, toss them in 1–2 tbsp flour first to prevent them from sinking.
- 5. Divide the batter evenly among the 12 muffin cups (they'll be about $\frac{3}{4}$ full).
- 6. Mix the topping (sugar + cinnamon) and sprinkle over each muffin if using.
- 7. Bake for 18–22 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted in the centre comes out clean.
- 8. Cool in the pan for 5 minutes, then transfer to a wire rack.
